For Whom?

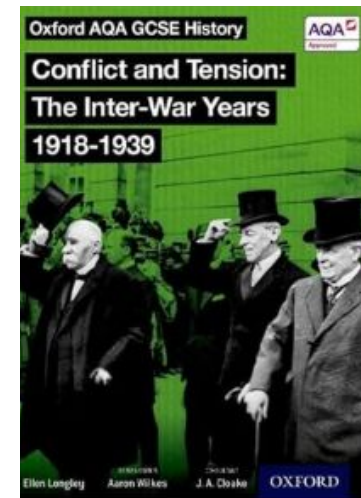
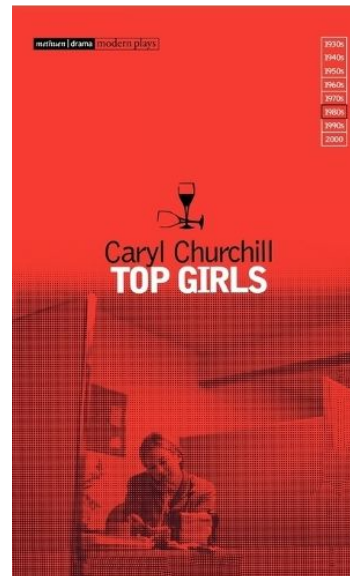
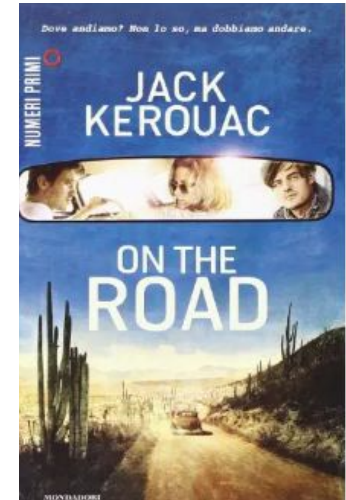
- English-speaking students of all nationalities

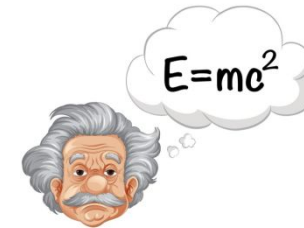

The SIA – Who are we at the SIA?

Six SIA teachers, native English speakers or experience living in the UK or the US for the BFI courses, and the LFA teaching staff and administration for the general national Bac courses

French Ministry of Education supervises all of the international sections and oversees the BFI

Oxford University Press Education Division guarantees A-level standards, cooperating with the French Ministry of Education on elaboration of the Bac exam and marking standards.

Asiba – the Association of British International Sections is the partner of the French Ministry and organises teacher training and oral exams. The organisation also organises Masterclasses for the community.

This cooperation guarantees that the BFI qualifies students as apt to study in France or an English speaking country. The BFI has been awarded 4 A-levels in the UCAS profile.

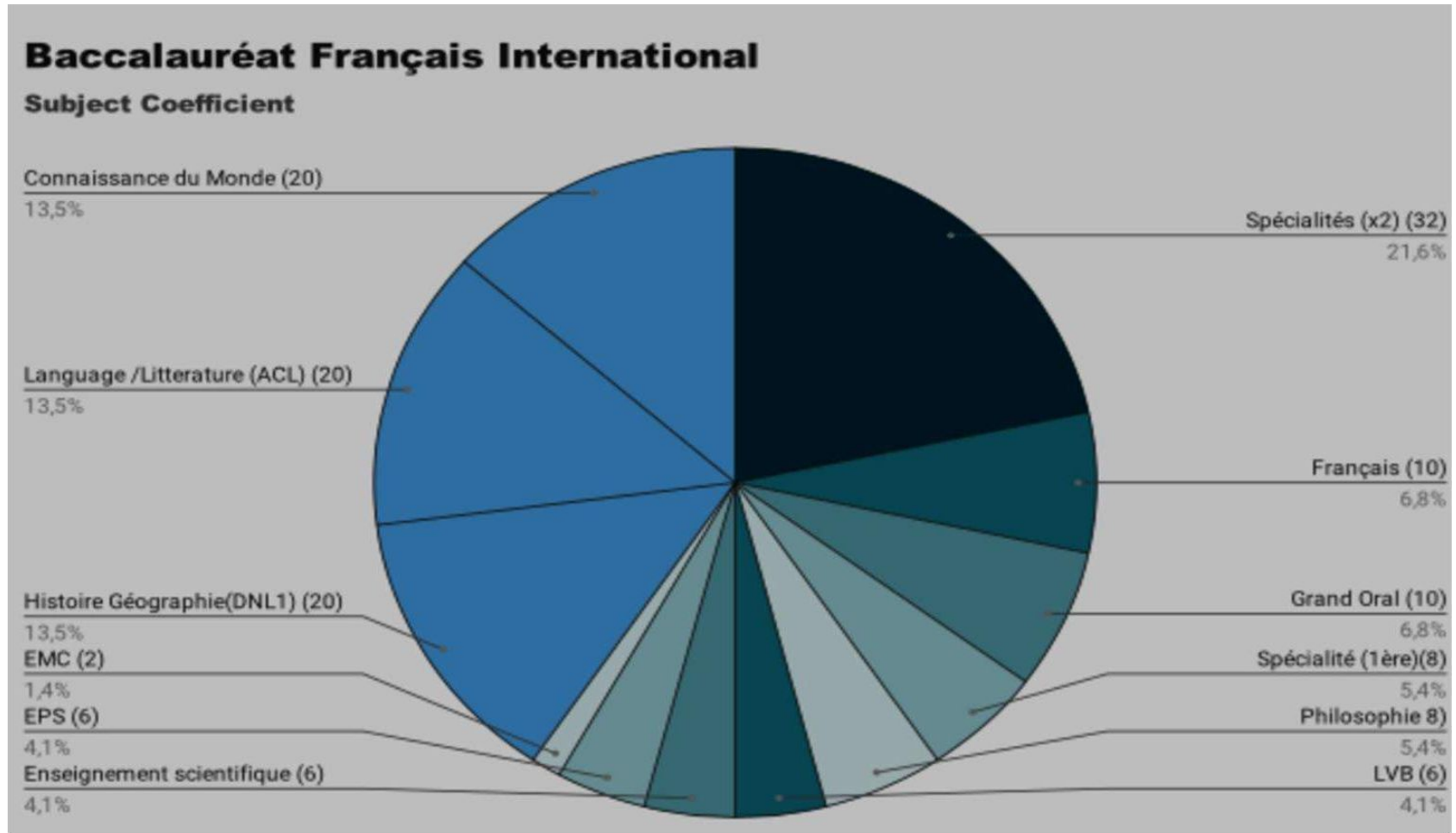

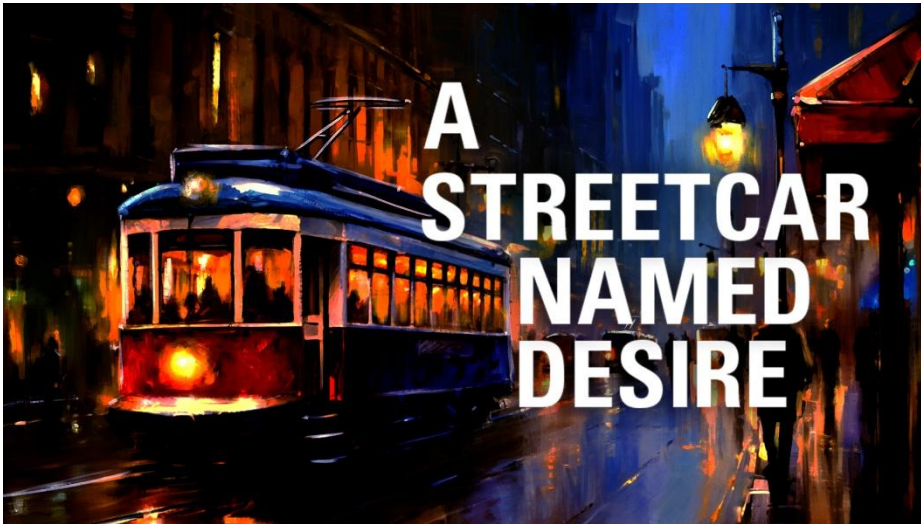

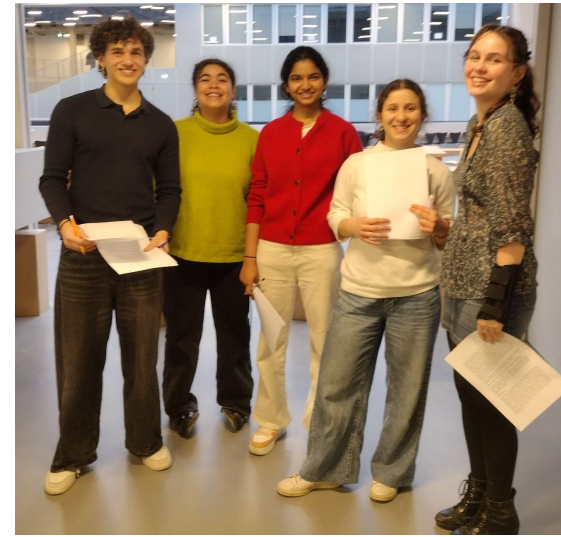

ORIENT

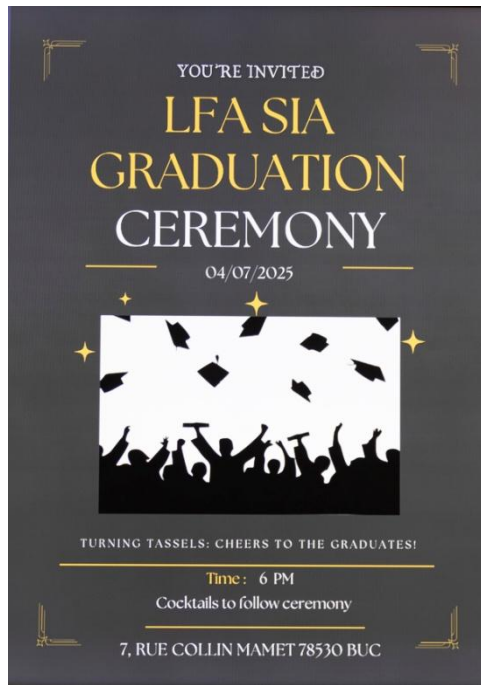
- In January of 2e year meeting with specialty teachers to help students choose specialty subjects

- Specific University courses in English information meeting, including Q&A with SIA alumni

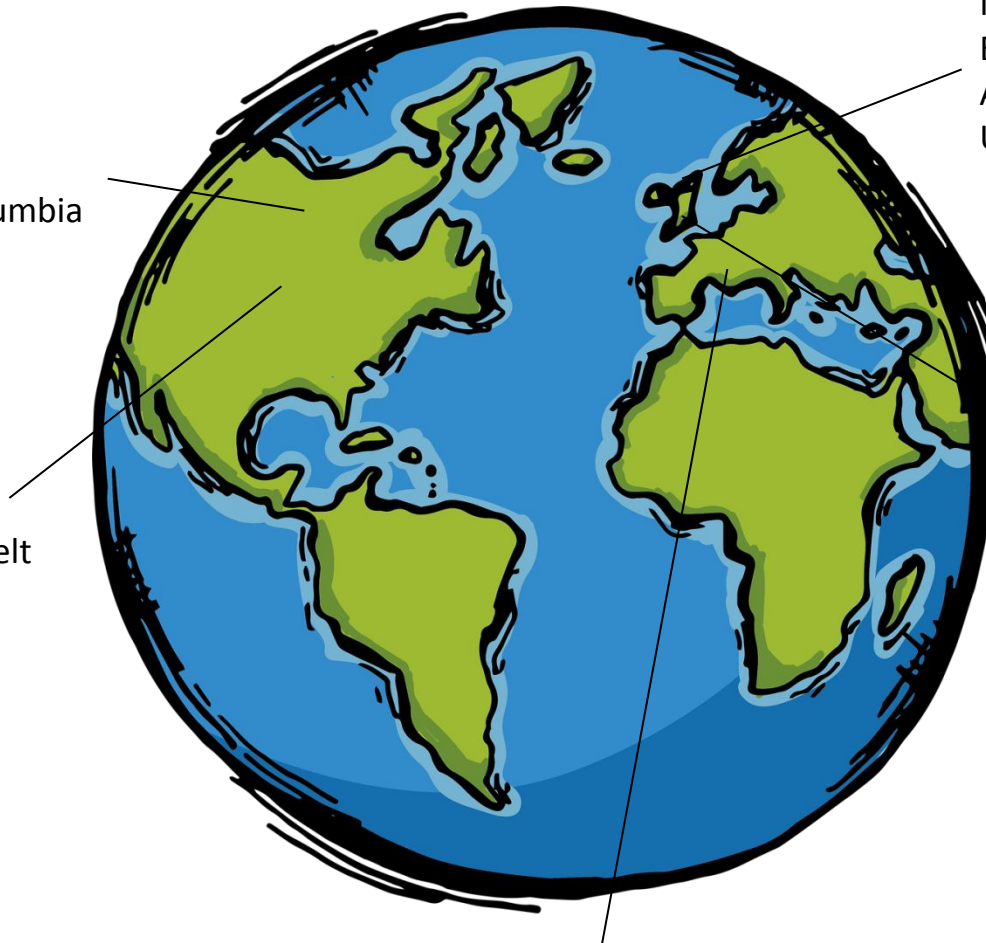
GUIDE

How to Apply to the SIA

- Applications are available on the LFA site. The deadline is January 22nd at 4 pm.
- On-site entrance evaluations will take place on February 2nd and 3rd.
- Entrance evaluations include a written assessments in English literature and History/Geography (2 hours), and an interview before a jury of two teachers. Remote testing is also available for candidates living outside of France.
- Notification of the results is in March.
